

247 Curtains – Wave Headed Curtain – Specification

Fitted like a normal blind, wave headed curtains are fitted to a track which can be fitted within or on the outside of a window recess. This style provides a uniform finish coupled with the versatility in colour, texture and designs soft fabrics provide.

These curtains arrived with a lining of your choice, as a pair by default. Single panels available if you give us a ring on 01484 443790.

The wave track is included free of charge with your order.

Symmetrical folds are created by track, spacing between the folds is approx. 80mm.

On Measuring

Wave curtains have a minimum stack height (this is the height the curtain takes up when fully open) of 40cm at the smallest size available.

This size can vary on the chosen blind fabric.

Components, Linings & Care

Track & Brackets

The single-rail track is white painted over metal. 19mm projection, 40mm height.

Brackets are white painted steel (100mm projection, 75mm clearance between wall and track).

Bracket back plate is 410mm width by 3.6mm drop at largest point.

Pleats

Fabric pleats have a runner space between them of 80mm

Depth of pleats is 39-45mm on one side of the track (78-90mm total depth).

Header (exposed) tape is 80mm drop

Hooks

Zinc-plated hooks are included free of charge.

Linings

Your new wave headed curtain are available with standard lining, blackout or thermal bonded interlining.

Joins

Please note that curtain with a width greater than the stated cloth width will have a vertical seam due to the fabric width/design.

Fabric

Overlocked edges to ensure a durable finish

Due to the softened fabric, fabric creasing may be visible out of the box.

Though we pack as carefully as possible to avoid this, please be aware these should naturally “drop out” over 3-7 days.

Allow up to two weeks training for heavier fabrics, such as velvets, for the best result.
